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POLICY RESPONSE

NEW ANNUAL LEAVE POLICY FOR EPA NON-FACULTY EMPLOYEES

The University Board of Trustees recently approved a significant change to the annual leave policy for EPA non-faculty employees. This change became effective on July 1, 2001. For additional details on this policy, see the Human Resources web site at http://www.ais.unc.edu/hr/

Why did EPA Non-Faculty employees need a new leave policy?

There has always been a provision for exceptional leave for EPA non-faculty. Previously each application for exceptional leave had to be dealt with individually, and the Board usually only granted this leave to those departing a previous job. In the process of trying to fix this problem, the University discovered that other institutions simply grant a flat amount of leave each year.

What is the new leave policy for EPA Non-Faculty Employees?

Permanent full-time EPA Non-Faculty employees (research, instructional and senior administrative personnel) are now entitled to annual leave equal to 24 workdays per year. Annual leave is adjusted proportionately for permanent part-time employees who work halftime or more.

Is the total of 24 days of annual leave time available to employees in the beginning of the year?

Annual leave is accrued monthly at an amount equal to one-twelfth of the annual rate for each month the employee works or is on approved leave with pay. Monthly leave is earned when an employee works or is on approved leave with pay at least half the working days of a month.

What if an EPA Non-Faculty Employee currently earns more than the 24 days per year?

An incumbent employee who was earning more than 24 days per year as of July 1, 2001 is entitled to continue to earn leave at the current rate.

If accrued leave time is not used in the year it is earned, can it be carried over?

The maximum number of unused annual leave that may be accrued and carried forward from one year to the next is 30 workdays. Annual leave in excess of 30 days is automatically converted to sick leave at the end of the year.

Is it possible to get an advance on annual leave time not yet accrued?

Subject to institutional policy and approval by the employee's supervisor, it is possible for an employee to be advanced the amount of leave that can be accrued during the remainder of the year or during a twelvemonth period.

Are there any restrictions on when an employee may use annual leave time?

The scheduling of an employee's annual leave is subject to the approval of the employee's supervisor.
