# A campus-wide call for volunteers

to serve on a new chancellor's committee to develop strategies for a UNC Chapel Hill personnel policy:

During her remarks at our last Forum meeting (July 11, 2001), Vice Chancellor for Finance and Administration Nancy Suttenfield announced the formation of a committee to study the potential benefits of personnel management flexibility. Legislation has been proposed by the NC Senate to grant UNC campuses authority to separate from the Office of State Personnel, and design personnel policies appropriate to their particular needs. The Vice Chancellor's announcement followed a Forumsponsored community meeting with Chancellor James Moeser, Provost Robert Shelton and Secretary of the Faculty Joe Farrell. The issue of personnel management flexibility was the chief topic of a spirited discussion. The announcement of the study also followed a meeting I had with the Chancellor and Nancy Suttenfield, at which I requested such a study. There are four good reasons for beginning this process now.

*First,* even if the authorizing legislation does not become law this year, we can count on more vigorous attempts to push this proposal in the future. The Administration, as well as our legislative delegation, is solidly behind the idea, which Nancy Suttenfield defended forcefully in her July 17<sup>th</sup> guest column

in the Chapel Hill Herald. There is a very strong likelihood that it will come to pass eventually. Why not prepare for that day?

Second. there is considerable suspicion on campus that employees' protections and benefits, currently enjoyed under the State Personnel Act (SPA) could be in jeopardy if we are separated from the Office of State Personnel. The Chancellor and his senior administrators have been consistent in their assurances that our employees will be well represented in the effort to design a personnel system tailored to the needs of our campus. How do we learn to trust such assurances from a new administration? That's simple. We begin the study by including employee representatives.

**Third,** by beginning the study now, there is a reasonable opportunity that the work of the committee could help shape the language of future legislative proposals to preserve and enhance the protections and benefits that have, historically, made employment by the University attractive.

Fourth, criticism of current legislative proposals for management flexibility rely heavily on the belief that the Office of State Personnel will provide for current benefits and protections for SPA staff forever. This is in no way a safe assumption. Legislators have already introduced a bill that would overhaul the OSP.

Our call for volunteers is not only a function of recommending staff members to serve on this committee, which will be by chancellor's appointment. It is also a way of identifying interested staff to serve the Forum as a resource to help coordinate and assist our campus community in research and policy recommendations. Our intention is that every single staff member interested in this process will have the opportunity to participate.
