UNC Policy Response: star heels award program

The Employee Forum would like to acknowledge and thank Laurie Charest and Mark Meares from the Development office who worked with TIAA CREFF to create this project. Where does the funding come from to support this award?

The Star Heels Award Program is made possible by the generous sponsorship of TIAA-CREF.

What is the purpose of the Star Heels Award Program?

The program provides awards to individual departments in order to recognize and reward excellent employees. Under this program, departments are given flexibility to choose award criteria and timing of awards

Who can submit a nomination for an award?

All University employees (including temporaries) are eligible to submit nominations.

Who can be nominated?

All permanent employees. This includes SPA, EPA Non-Faculty, and Faculty. Recipients are selected on a departmental level then submitted

to the Employee Services Department for award distribution.

What does the recipient of a Star Heel award receive?

Award recipients will receive a \$20 gift certificate from one of the following local/University establishments: A Southern Season, UNC Student Stores/UNC One Card, Lowes, University Mall. Recipients may choose whichever certificate they would prefer.

How many awards will our department receive?

The number of awards allocated to each department is based on the number of employees within each department. Letters were mailed to all Human Resources Facilitators last week detailing the program and letting departments know the number of awards they will have to give out.

What are the criteria for the award?

Departments will establish their own mechanisms for determining individual recipients.

Do I submit my nomination directly to Employee Services?

No. Your departmental Human Resources Facilitator will submit the names of recipients from your Department along with short award justifications via an electronic nomination form to the Employee Services Department.

How will recipeints get their gift certificate?

Employee Services will send certificates to recipients. Names of recipients will be published in the University Gazette.

What happens if our department doesn't give out all of it's awards?

All awards not given out by April 30^{th} of each year will be reallocated to other departments.
